1 **Board Policies Blair-Taylor School District** 2 3 4 **STUDENTS** Series: 400 5 6 Section: 440 STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES Policy #: 447.2 **BULLYING** 7 8 9 10 Introduction 11 The Blair-Taylor School District strives to provide a safe, secure and respectful learning 12 environment for all students, staff and others in school buildings, on school grounds, on school 13 buses and at school-sponsored activities. Bullying has a harmful social, physical, psychological 14 and academic impact on bullies, victims and bystanders. The school district consistently and 15 vigorously addresses bullying so that there is no disruption to the learning environment, learning 16 process, and school climate. 17 Definition 18 Bullying is deliberate or intentional behavior using words or actions, intended to cause fear, 19 intimidation or harm. Bullying may be repeated behavior and involves an imbalance of power. 20 The behavior may be motivated by an actual or perceived distinguishing characteristic, such as, 21 but not limited to: age; national origin; race; ethnicity; religion; gender; gender identity; sexual 22 orientation; physical attributes; physical or mental ability or disability; and social, economic or 23 family status. 24 Bullying behavior can be: 25 1. **Physical** (e.g. assault, hitting or punching, kicking, theft, threatening behavior) 26 2. Verbal (e.g. threatening or intimidating language, teasing or name-calling, racist 27 remarks) 28 3. **Indirect** (e.g. spreading cruel rumors, intimidation through gestures, social exclusion and 29 sending insulting messages or pictures by mobile phone or using the internet - also 30 known as cyber bullying) 31 **Prohibition** 32 Bullying behavior is prohibited in all schools, buildings, property and educational environments, 33 including any property or vehicle owned, leased or used by the school district. This includes 34 public transportation regularly used by students to go to and from school. Educational 35 environments include, but are not limited to, every activity under school supervision. 36 Procedure for Reporting/Retaliation 37 All school staff members and school officials who observe or become aware of acts of bullying 38 are required to report these acts to the building principal. If the building principal is the bully it 39 should be reported to the superintendent.

Any other person, including a student who is either a victim of the bullying or is aware of the

bullying or any other concerned individual is encouraged to report the conduct to the building

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principal.

43 Reports of bullying may be made verbally or in writing and may be made confidentially. All such 44 reports, whether verbal or in writing, will be taken seriously and a clear account of the incident is 45 to be documented. A written record of the report, including all pertinent details, will be made by 46 the recipient of the report. 47 The school official receiving a report of bullying will immediately notify the school district 48 employee assigned to investigate the report. The following school district employees have been 49 identified as the investigator: Building principal. 50 There shall be no retaliation against individuals making such reports. Individuals engaging in 51 retaliatory behavior will be subject to disciplinary action. 52 Procedure for investigating reports of bullying 53 The person assigned by the district to conduct an investigation of the bullying report will, within 54 one school day, interview the person(s) who are the victim(s) of the bullving and collect whatever 55 other information is necessary to determine the facts and the seriousness of the report. 56 Parents and/or guardians of each pupil involved in the bullying will be notified prior to the 57 conclusion of the investigation. The district will maintain the confidentiality of the report and any 58 related pupil records to the extent required by law. 59 60 Sanctions and supports If it is determined that students/staff participated in bullying behavior or retaliated against anyone 61 62 due to the reporting of bullying behavior, the school district administration and school board may 63 take disciplinary action, including: suspension, expulsion and/or referral to law enforcement 64 officials for possible legal action as appropriate. School counselors will provide support for the 65 identified victim(s). 66 **Disclosure and Public Reporting** 67 The policy will be distributed annually to all students enrolled in the school district, their parents and/or guardians and employees, and all current staff members. It will also be distributed to 68 69 organizations in the community having cooperative agreements with the schools. The school 70 district will also provide a copy of the policy to any person who requests it. 71 Records will be maintained on the number and types of reports made, and sanctions imposed for 72 incidents found to be in violation of the bullying policy. 73 An annual summary report shall be prepared and presented to the school board by the building 74 principal at the regular June board meeting. The report will include trends in bullying behavior 75 and recommendations on how to further reduce bullying behavior.
