Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct has been developed by the faculty advisory council of the Blair-Taylor Chapter of the National Honor Society in order to clarify expectations of students who have been inducted into the National Honor Society.

Students who exhibit exemplary scholarship, leadership, character and service are eligible for induction into the National Honor Society. Students who are inducted are expected to maintain the standards in these areas in order to maintain their membership in the National Honor Society. Students who do not maintain the standards will be subject to a warning or dismissal.

Scholarship: 3.33 GPA or higher

Leadership: Positive attitude and influence on others; resourceful and responsible; demonstrates initiative in promoting school activities; able to delegate responsibility.

Character: Respectful, responsible, trustworthy, fair, caring; upholds principles of morality and ethics; accepts criticism; consistently exemplifies desirable qualities.

Service: Activities done without financial or material compensation; usually outside of school.

***NHS Students are required to participate in at least 15 hours of service outside the school day during one calendar year in order to maintain NHS membership. Students must provide documentation of hours of service, signed by the supervisor.**

A student will be **subject to a warning** for the following violations:

- GPA falling below 3.33
- (Student will be given one trimester to bring GPA back up to 3.33 or higher, or student will be subject to dismissal)
- Exhibiting character or leadership unbecoming of a National Honor Society member.
 - Failing to participate in the minimum number of hours of service required to maintain membership.

A student will be **subject to dismissal** for the following violations:

- Drinking or having in possession alcoholic or malt beverages.
- Using or having in possession illegal drugs of any kind.
- Using or having in possession any forms of tobacco (smoking, chewing, etc.).
- Committing a legally punishable criminal act or other immoral or unacceptable act.
- In school or out of school suspension
- Athletic Code Violation

If the faculty advisory council determines that a dismissal may be warranted, the council will notify the member in writing of the action being contemplated, the reasons for the action, and the date and time of a pre-dismissal hearing. At the hearing, the member would be allowed to present his or her case in accordance with due process procedures. An appeal of the faculty advisory council's decision would go to the principal.
